### 1. A Tribute to architect Charles Correa

#### June 19th, 2015 AV Room, Brick School of Architecture Attended by students and faculty of the institute

Architect Charles Correa an Indian architect and urban planner known for his adaptation of Modernist tenets to local climates and building styles. In the realm of urban planning, he is particularly noted for his sensitivity to the needs of the urban poor and for his use of traditional methods and materials. India lost on June 16th 2015. He was a master architect, and guru of modernism for number of budding Architects in the nation. Brick School of Architecture and interior designing had organised an event to give tribute to him.

The chief guest invited for this event were, architect Narendra Dengle, and architect Rohit Poddar. Dengale sir a senior architect, had worked with Correa as an associate Architect. Rohit a young architect got his company during his internship days. Both had worked in close Association with him. This event was an opportunity to know many other sides of him which are not published.

Both of them have worked with him at different times. Degale sir shared his approach of studying the context and giving the modern solution in a pure language of architecture. He gave a presentation of some of his projects and how they are inspired by nature, and climatology.

Rohit being a young trainee was equipped with latest software and at that time Correa was close to his retirement. Rohit also shared his experiences of his flexibility to adopt modern software and engage the new generation with their computer skills. Looking at these software he took most use of it in his designs.

The event was honored by two renowned personalities, Senior architect, Prashant Deshmukh and young Artist Prashant Modak.

School Principal Ar. Poorva Keskar introduced Chief Guest Ar. Prashant Deshmukh to the Audience.

Ar. Prashant Deshmukh is director of "Prashant Deshmukh and Associates" architectural firm. This firm is pioneered by sir in the year 1986 is ISO 9001:2008 company and is winner of a number of awards for their projects designed and executed in projects in various countries like, Sri Lanka, Indonesia, Algeria and the Middle- East with their office bases in Mumbai, Pune & Daman. A number of industrial, commercial and educational Projects of this firm have won highest appreciation at the National Level.

Poorva introduced Artist Tejas Modak to the audience. The young professional graduated in Applied Art from Abhinav Kala Mahavidyalaya in 2006 is the author and artist of Private - eye Anonymous : The Art Gallery Case - a graphic novel that was published in 2008 by Westland Books. His second graphic novel Animal Palette was published in 2011 and showcased at the Jaipur Literature Festival in 2012.

Tejas has been the art director of Marathi Movie "Happy Journey " and has been awarded for this work at "Maharashtra Rajya Chitrapat Mahotsava"

Tejas has participated in a few group shows and has had two solo shows. He experiments with various media and creates works that are an amalgamation of his external environment and personal perception. Poorva mam honored Prashant sir by gifting a painting "Making of Brick School" done by Artist Navanath and requested him to give his message on the subject of "Social Responsibilities of the architect".

Sir started his speech by relating the real independence with comparison of Germany and India. Germany was collapsed in year 1946, and India was an independent nation in year 1947. Today Germany has reached the way beyond in terms of economic development as compared to India. Students shall keep ideal of the great people like APJ Abdul Kalam, who dreamed for India to be super power by year 2020.

He put the idea of working for our nation after the studies. Studying in abroad is a good idea as one gets exposure to the world of knowledge and best practices, but our social responsibility is to use our expertise for our own nation.

He explained the work of architect with example of a community of stone cutters. Stone cutting is considered as bread and butter for few people, for few people it is only hard work, but for a group of people it is the event of temple building and we belong to this temple building group. Our products of hard work and thinking should come in front of people in the form of a temple, i.e., piece of art, hard work , a permanent structure and a place of faith and respect.



There are number of competitor whom we have to face, but we should develop capability to market our self and sell our ideas in a unique form. For this we first have to present our work with perfection and keep the tendency of promotion, day to day improvisation and to be updated with the upcoming technologies. Our profession seeks synergy of Art and Technology, detailed knowledge and ability to work within given time frame. We all get equal opportunities, but our vision of "when, where and how" and action plan leads us to progress in life.

He briefed about the CSR activities happening at his firm. His firm is taking part in SWACH Bharat and National Literacy Mission of India, and Teachers' training and E-learning program. They are also contributing to WASH (Water Supply, Sanitation and Hygiene) program of Indian government with mission of building 10,000 toilets in all over the India. Regarding this he asked students to design cost effective toilets for this mission.

He advised students to do SWOT (strength, weakness, opportunities and threats) analysis and design based on the projected returns.

Prashant sir gifted a working drawings' portfolio of their project "Ross Process Equipment Pvt. Ltd." to library of Brick School.

Academic Co-ordinator Ar. Anand Iyer gave vote of thanks to the guest.











### 3. Chai with an Author

#### August 15 th, 2015 Muktangan, Brick School of Architecture Attended by students and faculty of the institute

Tea session was followed by Q and A session. Tejas gifted his books "Faster Feney" and "Private Eye Annonymous" to Brick Library.



Their other expertise included bottle craft, poster making, sketches and paintings too. Following are some of the photographs.
















### 9. Faculty Forum

30+ workshops by master architects were organised, more than 3000 aspiring architects and more than 200 architecture faculties participated from all over India. ## b) Special Mention in Westminster Trophy

The University of Westminster is a public university in London, United Kingdom. It is a registered charity, globally acclaimed for its department of architecture. Famous alumni of the architecture department are Roger Waters and Nick Mason of Pink Floyd. They interacted with the local government authorities and proposed to convert it in a playful area. 
### 4. Smart City Competition
