


Description of the Talk-

This was an informal interaction session with Prof. Bannerjee about How to guide students for thesis? How to structure the semester? How to set targets and guidelines etc.Prof. Bannerjee presented how she herself structures her semester and how its commenced. The semester is divided into 4 parts with deadines for each month, starting from topic finalisation and case studies to site selction and project brief followed by final design.

She guided the faculty, how to keep the students motivated. What are the responsibilities of a teacher. She also talked about how to tackle common problems and glitches in the semester.

Introduction:

The faculty in Brick is always thinking about how to give their best to their respective subjects. To encourage the faculty more and also to guide them further in their endeavors, a one day faculty improvement workshop was organized at Brick, by Prof. jayashree Deshpande.

Brief introduction of the Chief guest:

Prof. Jayashree Deshpande is an architect and educator based in Pune, India. She is the recipient of several awards and scholarships in academics and has been felicitated by the Indian Institute of Architects, for her extraordinary contribution to the field of Architectural Education, being instrumental in setting up Master's and Doctoral Courses in Architecture at the University of Pune. Jayashree is associated with various Universities in the advisory capacity for the subjects of architecture, education and design. Jayashree is a member of several national and international professional bodies and has presented numerous papers on architectural education, housing practices and sustainable development at national and international conferences and workshops. She specialises in training teachers in improving pedagogies and development of inter personal skills for effective teaching.

She compiles and edits the book series on the Thesis Awards programme of Council of Architecture and India's Master Architects in Maharashtra. Jayashree was Content Editor and resource person for 'JIIA', the refereed Journal of IIA and 'NAM', the newsletter of the Indian Institute of Architects, Maharashtra Chapter. She is the Executive Publisher and Assistant Editor of JCOA- the refereed Journal of Council of Architecture. She also writes in the local media.

As Director, Academic Unit of Council of Architecture, at Pune, Jayashree Deshpande is involved in conducting and coordinating Faculty Induction Programmes and Training & Continuing Education Programmes for teachers in schools of architecture and practicing architects, Thesis Awards

The Workshop

The workshop was a full day workshop divided into 4 modules. 2 Pre-lunch modules and 2 post lunch modules. The programme, specially designed for faculty members of schools of architecture, aims to sensitize teachers about new concepts in teaching and hopes to enable the participants to develop competence in understanding recent advances in education technology, to learn to improve pedagogies and to better their inter personal skills to become effective faculty.

Module 1: Qualities of an effective teacher

In view of the multiple roles that a teacher is expected to play, there is a need to understand the importance of soft skills like, leadership; communication skills; critical thinking; problem-solving; team work; life-long learning; good professional relationship; punctuality; integrity; personal grooming; attitudes and values; basic skills of self management and management of others and resources.



Module 2: Learning Styles

Every individual has a distinct learning style and therefore differs in the ways of learning and processing information. In order to avoid distracted students, less attendance for lectures, failure in exams and disinterested students, a teacher must develop a teaching style appropriate to the learning requirements of various types of learners. For improved classroom output, it is essential that a teacher should first know his/her own learning style and also the student's learning styles.

Module 3: Classroom management and anger communication.

Classroom management is the process of ensuring that classroom lessons run smoothly despite disruptive behaviour by students. It also implies the prevention of disruptive behaviour. It is a difficult aspect of teaching for many teachers. Skills such as effective classroom management are central to teaching and require common sense, consistency, a sense of fairness and courage. These skills also require that teachers understand the psychological and developmental levels of their students at the same time recognise if someone is becoming angry and take appropriate action to deal with the situation in a positive way.

Module 4: Mentoring

The concept of mentoring has found application in virtually every forum of learning. Mentoring is important, because it provides professional socialization and personal support to facilitate students' success in school and their professional evolution. Quality mentoring greatly enhances students' chances for success, improves academic track record and develops a greater career advancement potential.

The activity based workshop was a lot of fun and helped faculty revisit their methods of teaching and also retrospect about the same. It helped understand their own strengths and weaknesses and different learning and teaching styles. The faculty found it useful in implementing the take always from this workshop in their teaching.
